JURASSIC COAST



Let me tell you a little about the jurassic coast. It is a 96 mile long world heritage site on the English Channel coast of southern England and stretches from Exmouth in East Devon to Studland Bay in Dorset.

According to Dr Ajana "it is the only place on earth..." that shows almost continuous sequence of rock formation through coastal erosion, spanning 185 million years. What stories there are to hear, see, smell and share in the dramatic cliffs, secluded coves, coastal stocks and barrier beaches. The tilt of the rocks creates a unique walk through time.

TELLING OUR STORY

At various times the Jurassic coast has been a desert, shallow tropical sea and marsh land. Fossilised remains of the various creatures that lived here are preserved in the rocks.



We shall meditate and hear our ancestors speak the truth about this matter. I feel we need to touch base with these places otherwise the stories of our connection to this land will forever be lost or told to us by the Johnny come lately caucasian.
